Re: SB 808 Exemption/Florida State Boxing Commission

Dear Senator Galvano:

We are writing to express our concerns regarding SB 808, creating an exemption from the public records law for proprietary confidential business information in reports submitted to the Florida State Boxing Commission by a promoter. We believe this exemption, at least without further clarification, is unwarranted.

Specifically, the constitutionally-required statement of public necessity is speculative at best, particularly when one considers the fact that boxing promoters have functioned "in the Sunshine" for many years. Without more factual specificity regarding the critical need for such an exemption, this bill fails to meet the standard for creating an exception to the constitutional right of access to public records under Article I, section 24, Fla. Con.

Publicly-owned venues routinely base the amount to be charged promoters on total attendance or total ticket sales; without the public's ability to access that information, a promoter and public official would be unduly shielded from censure of any "sweetheart" deals.

For these reasons, Senator Galvano, we will respectfully oppose SB 808 unless there is some significant change and additional, fact-specific information is added to the constitutionally-required statement of public necessity. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact us.
