Re: SB 1324 Exemption/Agency Personnel Information

Dear Senator Latvala:

We are writing to express our opposition to SB 1324, expanding exemptions for information of current and former law enforcement personnel, certain specified employees in the Department of Health, Department of Revenue, and Department of Children and Families, states attorneys, and statewide prosecutors. It is our position that SB 1324 is unconstitutionally overbroad and violates Article 1, s. 24(c), of the Florida Constitution.

Of particular concern is the breadth and vagueness of the proposed exemptions. The law presently exempts the home address of the specified officers and employees for the purpose of reasonably ensuring the safety and privacy of their homes and their immediate families. The proposed expansion to exempt the address of secondary residences, driver license numbers, license plate numbers, email addresses, and former places of employment, does not serve such a specific purpose. In fact, the proposed exemptions effectively eliminate oversight and accountability for these personnel by taking their entire history out of the public view. This is simply bad public policy and is an unwarranted expansion of reasonable protections already in law. SB 1324 erects an unacceptable barrier to our constitutional right of access.

Public oversight and government accountability are the bedrocks of open government. To that end, our law requires exemptions be narrowly construed and no broader than necessary to achieve their specified purpose. This bill would set a dangerous precedent of disregarding the Constitution to

arbitrarily restrict the public's right of access. For these reasons, we respectfully suggest SB 1324 be withdrawn from further consideration. If you have any questions about our position, Senator Latvala, please do not hesitate to contact us.
