COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES

CS/HB 351 Exemption/Executive Searches – Universities and Colleges: Creates a public record exemption for information identifying applicants for president, provost or dean of a state university or college. Also creates an exemption for meetings held for the purpose of identifying or vetting such applicants, stipulating that the exemption does not apply to those meetings held to establish qualifications or determine compensation. Meetings held after a final group of applicants has been selected for the purpose of making a final selection will be open and the names of the final group of applicants will be selected. Creates s. 1004.097, F.S. Companion to SB 478. *Rep. Bob Rommel (R-Naples)* 😞

- H. Education Committee: Reported favorably by a vote of 15/1, with Rep. Asencio voting no. Now on the House Calendar.

HB 5601 Public Records/Higher Education Direct Support Organizations: Currently, all university and college direct support organization records *other than* an auditor's report, management letter, and supplemental data requested by the Board of Governors, the board of trustees, the Auditor General, and Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability are confidential and exempt. HB 5601 repeals the exemptions, meaning that all records of the DSOs will be subject to disclosure absent other statutory exemptions that may apply. The identity of donors who desire anonymity will remain exempt. Amends ss. 1004.28 and 1004.70, F.S. *H. Appropriations Committee* 😊

HB 5601 is on the House Special Order Calendar for Wednesday, April 12.

COURTS

CS/HB 239 Exemption/Protective Injunction Petitions: Creates a public record exemption for injunctions for protection against domestic violence, repeat violence, dating violence, sexual violence, stalking, or cyber stalking that are dismissed without a hearing or at an ex parte hearing due to failure to state a claim, lack of jurisdiction, or the sufficiency of the petition without an injunction being issued on or after July 1, 2017. Such petitions before July 1, 2017, will be exempt only upon the written request of the person named in the petition as a respondent. Amends s. 119.0714, F.S. Companion to SB 1062. *Rep. Larry Lee (D-Fort Pierce)*

- House: Passed the House unanimously. Now in Senate Messages.

CS/HB 441 Court Records/Liability: Stipulates that a clerk of court is not liable for the inadvertent release of confidential information contained in a court record if the filer of the record failed to disclose the existence of such information as required by court rule. Amends s. 119.0714(2), F.S.

Companion to SB 202. *Rep. Ben Diamond (D-St. Petersburg)* 😊

- H. Judiciary Committee: Reported favorably. Now on the House Calendar.

CS/HB 791 Exemption/Petitions for Involuntary Assessment: Creates a public record exemption for all pleadings and other documents relating to involuntary assessment and stabilization filed with or by a court. Also exempts personal identifying information published on a court docket and maintained by the clerk of court related to involuntary assessments and stabilizations. Allows access by certain specified persons and entities. Creates s. 397.6760. Companion to SB 886. *Rep. Stan McClain (R-Ocala)*

- H. Health and Human Services Committee: Reported favorably. Now on the House Calendar.

CS/SB 886 Exemption/Petitions for Involuntary Assessment: Creates a public record exemption for petitions of involuntary assessment and stabilization, court orders, and related records filed with a court. Also provides an exemption for the personal identifying information contained in such records published on a court docket. Allows access by court order. Amends s. 397.6815, F.S. Companion to HB 791. *Sen. Dennis Baxley (R-Lady Lake)*

- S. Rules Committee: Reported favorably. **CS/SB 886 is on the Senate Special Order Calendar for Thursday, April 13.**

HB 7087 OGSR/Identifying Information – Victims of Violence: Reenacts, without modification, the public record exemption for the home and employment telephone numbers, cell phone numbers, home or employment addresses, and e-mail addresses of victims of specified violent crimes (domestic violence, repeat violence, sexual violence, and dating violence) provided to the clerks of court and law enforcement in order for the victims to receive automatic notification when a restraining order requested by the victim has been served. Requires the victims to request protection of their personal information in writing and stipulates that the information will be subject to public disclosure five years after the written request is received. Reenacts ss. 741.30(8)(c) and 784.046(8)(c), F.S. *H. Oversight, Transparency and Administration Subcommittee*

- House: Passed the House unanimously. Now in Senate Messages.

CRIMINAL JUSTICE and LAW ENFORCEMENT

CS/SB 118 Criminal History Records and Mug Shots: Prohibits those who publish mug shots from soliciting or accepting a fee to remove, correct, or modify a mug shot. Requires such publishers to remove a mug shot within 10 days of receiving a written request for removal. Allows the person whose mug shot was published to bring a civil action to enjoin the continued publication of the mug shot if not removed after receiving the written request and allows a court to impose a civil penalty of \$1,000 per day for noncompliance with an order of injunction. Stipulates that refusal to remove a mug shot upon written request constitutes an unfair or deceptive trade practice and that the requirements of the bill apply only to those who solicit or accept payments to remove a mug shot. Also amends s. 943.0585, F.S., to allow for the expunction of a criminal history record when the subject of the record was acquitted or found not guilty if the person seeking expunction has not been previously been found guilty of a misdemeanor or felony. Amends s. 943.0585, F.S. Companion to HB 857. *Sen. Greg Steube (R-Sarasota)*

- Senate: Amended on third reading; passed the Senate unanimously as amended. CS/SB 118 prohibits those who publish mug shots from soliciting or accepting a fee to remove, correct, or modify a mug shot. Requires such publishers to remove a mug shot within 10 days of receiving a written request for removal. Allows the person whose mug shot was published to bring a civil action to enjoin the continued publication of the mug shot if not removed after receiving the written request and allows a court to impose a civil penalty of \$1,000 per day for noncompliance with an order of injunction. Stipulates that refusal to remove a mug shot upon written request constitutes an unfair or deceptive trade practice and that the requirements of the bill apply only to those who solicit or accept payments to remove a mug shot. Also amends s. 943.0586, F.S., to require the Criminal Justice Information program to administratively seal criminal history records relating to an arrest or incident of alleged criminal activity if notified by the clerk of court that charges weren't filed, were dismissed before trial, or the person charged was acquitted or found not guilty. Now in House Messages.

CS/SB 550 Exemption/Murder - Identity of Witnesses: Creates a public record exemption for the personal identifying information of those who witness a murder, stipulating that such information remains confidential and exempt for 2 years. Allows disclosure to a criminal justice agency or governmental entity for use in the performance of official duties and responsibilities and to the criminal defendant. Amends s. 119.071, F.S. Companion to HB 111. *Sen. Randolph Bracy (D-Ocoee)* ☹

- S. Rules Committee: Reported favorably by a vote of 10/2, with Sens. Bradley and Brandes voting no. **CS/SB 550 is on the Senate Special Order Calendar for Thursday, April 13.**

CS/SB 624 Review of Body Camera Footage: Amends the statutory provision requiring adoption of procedures regarding the use of body cameras to allow a law enforcement officer using a body camera to review the recorded footage, upon his or her request, before writing a report or providing a statement. Stipulates that the ability to review recorded footage doesn't apply to an officer's duty to immediately disclose information necessary to secure an active crime scene or to identify witnesses or suspects. Amends s. 943.1718, F.S. Companion to HB 305. *Sen. Greg Steube (R-Sarasota)* WATCH

- S. Rules Committee: Reported favorably. Now on the Senate Calendar.

SB 686 Exemption/Sexual Predators – Internet Identifiers: In pertinent part, SB 684 requires sexual predators to register all internet identifiers with FDLE. Defines "internet identifier" as any designation, moniker, screen name, username, or other name used for self-identification to send or receive social internet communications. SB 686 creates a public record exemption for email addresses and internet identifiers reported to FDLE. Amends s. 119.071(5), F.S. Companion to HB 701. *Sen. Dennis Baxley (R-Lady Lake)*

- S. Criminal Justice Committee: A strike all amendment making minor changes is adopted; reported favorably as a committee substitute. Now in S. Governmental Oversight and Accountability Committee.

CS/HB 857 Criminal History Records and Mug Shots: Prohibits those who publish mug shots from soliciting or accepting a fee to remove, correct, or modify a mug shot. Requires such publishers to remove a mug shot within 10 days of receiving a written request for removal. Allows the person whose mug shot was published to bring a civil action to enjoin the continued publication of the mug shot if not removed after receiving the written request and allows a court to impose a civil penalty of \$1,000 per day for

noncompliance with an order of injunction. Stipulates that refusal to remove a mug shot upon written request constitutes an unfair or deceptive trade practice and that the requirements of the bill apply only to those who solicit or accept payments to remove a mug shot. Also amends s. 943.0585, F.S., to allow for the expunction of a criminal history record when the subject of the record was acquitted or found not guilty if the person seeking expunction has not been previously been found guilty of a misdemeanor or felony. Amends s. 943.0585, F.S. Companion to SB 118. *Rep. Scott Plakon (R-Longwood)*

- H. Justice Appropriations Subcommittee: An amendment to the section of the bill dealing with expunction is adopted; reported favorably as a committee substitute. As amended, CS/SB 857 prohibits those who publish mug shots from soliciting or accepting a fee to remove, correct, or modify a mug shot. Requires such publishers to remove a mug shot within 10 days of receiving a written request for removal. Allows the person whose mug shot was published to bring a civil action to enjoin the continued publication of the mug shot if not removed after receiving the written request and allows a court to impose a civil penalty of \$1,000 per day for noncompliance with an order of injunction. Stipulates that refusal to remove a mug shot upon written request constitutes an unfair or deceptive trade practice and that the requirements of the bill apply only to those who solicit or accept payments to remove a mug shot. Also amends s. 943.0586, F.S., to require the Criminal Justice Information program to administratively seal criminal history records relating to an arrest or incident of alleged criminal activity if notified by the clerk of court that charges weren't filed, were dismissed before trial, or the person charged was acquitted or found not guilty. Now in S. Justice Committee.

SB 1526 Exemption/Department of Corrections – Health Information: Creates a public record exemption for “protected health information” of inmates and offenders held by the Department of Corrections. Also exempts the identity of inmates and offenders contained in HIV test records. Allows access under certain specified conditions. “Protected health information” is defined as individually identifiable health information transmitted or maintained electronically. Amends s. 945.10, F.S. Companion to HB 1203. *Sen. Randolph Bracy (R-Ocoee)*

- S. Governmental Oversight and Accountability Committee: Reported favorably. Now in S. Rules Committee.

ENVIRONMENT

CS/SB 532 Pollution Reports: Creates the “Public Notice of Pollution Act,” requiring the Department of Environmental Protection to establish and publish a list of substances, which if released or discharged, would present an immediate and substantial risk to the public health, safety or welfare. Requires owners and operators of facilities at which a reportable release occurred to report such release within 24 hours of discovery to DEP. Requires DEP to publish all such notices on a publicly accessible website and to create an email list for all notices, allowing the public and media to subscribe and receive periodic announcements of all notices submitted. Creates s. 403.078, F.S. Companion to HB 1065. *Sen. Bill Galvano (R-Bradenton)* WATCH

- S. Governmental Oversight and Accountability Committee: Reported favorably. Now on the House Calendar. **CS/SB 532 is on the Senate Special Order Calendar for Thursday, April 14.**

EXAMINATIONS AND INVESTIGATIONS

CS/SB 492 Exemption/Identifying Information – Victims of Alleged Sexual Harassment: Creates a public record exemption for information relating to an allegation of sexual harassment that could identify the victim. Amends s. 119.071, F.S. Companion to HB 397. *Rep. Dana Young (R-Tampa)*

- S. Governmental Oversight and Accountability Committee: Amended to allow access by other governmental entities in furtherance of official duties. Reported favorably as a committee substitute. Now S. Rules Committee.

CS/HB 981 Exemption/Investigations – Department of Elderly Affairs: Creates a public record exemption for the following information held by the Department of Elderly Affairs about investigations into complaints filed with the Department: (1) the names of the complainant and the ward involved; (2) the ward's personal health and financial records; and (3) photographs and videos related to the complaint or obtained during the investigation. Allows access by court order and stipulates that such information is subject to disclosure once the investigation is complete or no longer active. Creates s. 744.2111, F.S. Companion to SB 1408. *Rep. Julio Gonzalez (R-Venice)*

- H. Health and Human Services Committee: A minor technical amendment is adopted. Reported favorably as a committee substitute. Now on the House Calendar.

HOME ADDRESSES

SB 248 Exemption/Home Addresses – OFR Personnel: Creates a public record exemption for the home addresses, telephone numbers, dates of birth, and photographs of current or former non-sworn investigative personnel of the Office of Financial Regulation's Bureau of Financial Investigation whose duties include the investigation of fraud, theft, other related activities, or state regulatory violations. Also creates an exemption for the names, home addresses, telephone numbers, dates of birth, and places of employment of spouse and children, and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of such personnel. Creates s. 119.071(4)(d)2.V., F.S. Companion to HB 243. *Sen. Doug Broxson (R-Pensacola)*

- S. Banking and Insurance Committee: Reported favorably. Now in S. Governmental Oversight and Accountability Committee.

CS/SB 1108 Exemption/Home Addresses – Former Firefighters: Currently, there is a public record exemption for home addresses, telephone numbers, dates of birth, and photographs of certified firefighters, and for the names, home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, dates of birth, and places of employment of the spouses and children of such personnel, and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by their children. CS/SB 1108 extends the exemption to include former firefighters, which is consistent with other home address exemptions. Amends s. 119.071(4)2.b, F.S. Companion to HB 383. *Sen. Frank Artiles (R-Miami)*

- S. Rules Committee: Reported favorably. Now on the Senate Calendar.

HB 7093 OGSR/Home Address Exemptions: There are numerous home address exemptions for a variety of government employees and officers in s. 119.071(4). In 2012, the legislature expanded those exemptions to include within the exemption personal telephone numbers and dates of birth for all of the protected employees and their spouses and children. HB 7093 reenacts the exemptions and expands some to include the names of spouses and children of the employees. The legislation also deletes

requirements that those whose home addresses, etc. are exempt from disclosure take reasonable steps to insure that such information isn't available from other publicly-available sources. Amends s. 119.071(4), F.S. Companion to SB 7018. *H. Oversight, Transparency and Administration Subcommittee* ☹️

- H. Government Accountability Committee: Reported favorably. Now on the House Calendar.

INSURANCE

CS/HB 1009 Exemption/Insurer Anti-Fraud Plans: HB 1007 requires certain insurers to adopt anti-fraud plans and provide such information to the Department of Financial Services. CS/HB 1009 creates a public record exemption for information provided by an insurer describing the insurer's (1) required anti-fraud training and anti-fraud investigative unit; and (2) the rationale for the level of anti-fraud staffing and resources provided. Also exempts the (3) number of fraud matters referred to the anti-fraud investigative unit that were not claim related; (4) number of claims investigated or accepted by the anti-fraud investigative unit; (5) number of other insurance fraud matters investigated or accepted by the anti-fraud investigative unit that were not claim related; and (6) estimated dollar amount or range of damages. Amends s. 626.9891, F.S. Companion to SB 1014. *Rep. Holly Merrill Raschein (R-Key Largo)*

- H. Government Accountability Committee: Reported favorably. Now on the House Calendar.

SB 1014 Exemption/Insurer Anti-Fraud Plans: SB 1012 requires certain insurers to adopt anti-fraud plans and provide such information to the Department of Financial Services. SB 1014 creates a public record exemption for the following information submitted to DFS by an insurer: (1) the name of employees assigned to anti-fraud activities; (2) a description of an insurer's anti-fraud investigative unit; (3) anti-fraud plans; and (4) required statistical data and information. Amends s. 626.9891, F.S. Companion to HB 1009. *Sen. Jeff Brandes (R-St. Petersburg)*

- S. Banking and Insurance Committee: A strike all amendment expanding the proposed exemption is adopted. Reported favorably as a committee substitute. As amended, CS/SB 1014 creates a public record exemption for information provided by an insurer describing the insurer's (1) required anti-fraud training and anti-fraud investigative unit; and (2) the rationale for the level of anti-fraud staffing and resources provided. Also exempts the (3) number of fraud matters referred to the anti-fraud investigative unit that were not claim related; (4) number of claims investigated or accepted by the anti-fraud investigative unit; (5) number of other insurance fraud matters investigated or accepted by the anti-fraud investigative unit that were not claim related; and (6) estimated dollar amount or range of damages of cases referred to the Division of Investigative and Forensic Services or other agencies. Now in S. Governmental Oversight and Accountability Committee.

SB 2510 Exemption/Dependent Eligibility Verification Records: Creates a public record exemption for records collected by the Department of Management Services for the purpose of verifying dependent eligibility for state group insurance programs. Amends s. 110.12301, F.S. *S. Appropriations Committee*

OFFICIAL RECORDS

CS/HB 103 Exemption/Non-Viable Birth Certificates: HB 101 creates the "Grieving Families Act," authorizing the Department of Health to issue non-viable birth certificates upon request of the family. HB

103 creates a public record exemption for information relating to the cause of death, parentage, marital status of the parent, and any medical information included in non-viable birth records. Allows access by court order and for health research purposes. Amends s. 382.008, F.S. Companion to SB 674. *Rep. Bob Cortes (R-Altamonte Springs)*

- House: Passed the House unanimously. Now in Senate Messages.

PERSONAL INFORMATION

SB 1008 Exemption/Division of Workers' Compensation - Injured or Deceased Employees: Creates a public record exemption for personal identifying information of injured or deceased employees contained in notices or reports filed with the Division of Workers' Compensation within the Department of Financial Regulation. Amends s. 440.185, F.S. Companion to HB 1107. *Sen. Keith Perry (R-Gainesville)*

- S. Banking and Insurance Committee: A strike all amendment is adopted; reported favorably as a committee substitute. As amended, CS/SB 1008 creates s. 440.1851, F.S., providing a public record exemption for personal identifying information of injured or deceased employees contained in reports, notices, records, or supporting documentation held by the Department of Financial Services. Defines "personal identifying information" to include the employee's name, date of birth, home address, email address, and telephone number. Allows access under certain specified circumstances, including a court order and in aggregate reporting formats. Applies the exemption retroactively. Now in S. Governmental Oversight and Accountability Committee.

CS/SB 1024 Exemption/Homelessness Surveys: Creates a public record exemption for personal identifying information contained in homelessness surveys required by federal law. Creates s. 420.6231, F.S. Companion to HB 381. *Sen. Linda Stewart (D-Orlando)*

- S. Rules Committee: Reported favorably. Now on the Senate Calendar.

CS/HB 1107 Exemption/Division of Workers' Compensation - Injured or Deceased Employees: Creates a public record exemption for personal identifying information of injured or deceased employees contained in notices or reports filed with the Division of Workers' Compensation within the Department of Financial Regulation. Allows access by court order. Amends s. 440.185, F.S. Companion to SB 1008. *Rep. Ben Albritton (R-Bartow)*

- H. Commerce Committee: A minor amendment is adopted; reported favorably as a committee substitute. Now on the House Calendar.

SB 7026 OGSR/Unclaimed Property Reports: Reenacts, without modification, the exemption for social security numbers and property identifiers contained in unclaimed property reports held by the Department of Financial Services. Reenacts s. 717.117, F.S. Companion to HB 7045. *S. Banking and Insurance Committee*

- S. Governmental Oversight and Accountability Committee: Reported favorably. Now in S. Rules Committee.

HB 7095 Exemption/Personal Identifying Information – Medical Marijuana Use Registry: HB 1397 requires the Department of Health (DOH) to create a medical marijuana use registry. HB 7095 creates a public record exemption for patient and physician personal identifying information contained in the registry. Also creates an exemption for a physician's Drug Enforcement Administration number. Allows access under certain specified conditions. Amends s. 381.987, F.S. *H. Health Quality Subcommittee*

- H. Government Accountability Committee: Reported favorably by a vote of 20/1, with Rep. Smith voting no. Now in H. Health and Human Services Committee.

PROPRIETARY INFORMATION

SB 7024 OGSR/Title Insurance Companies – Proprietary Business Information: Reenacts, with minor changes, an exemption for proprietary confidential business information provided to the Office of Insurance Regulation by title insurance agencies and insurers. Defines “proprietary business information” as information that (1) is owned or controlled by the title insurance agency; (2) is intended to be and is treated by the company as private in that disclosure would cause harm to its business operations; and (3) has not been publicly disclosed. Reenacts s. 626.84195, F.S. Companion to HB 7067. *S. Banking and Insurance Committee*

- S. Governmental Oversight and Accountability Committee: Reported favorably. Now in S. Rules Committee.

PUBLIC RECORDS

CS/HB 163 Public Records/Reasonable Attorney Fees and Costs: Current law requires a court to award reasonable attorney fees and costs when the court finds that an agency violated the public records law. CS/HB 163 amends s. 119.12, F.S., requiring a court to award reasonable costs of enforcement, including attorney fees, to the requestor in lawsuits brought to enforce the public records law if a court (1) determines that the agency violated the law; and (2) the requestor notified the agency’s custodian of records in writing of the public record request five days prior to filing the lawsuit. Also requires a court to determine whether the public record request was for an “improper purpose,” and, if so, requires the court to award reasonable costs of enforcement against the requestor. “Improper purpose” is defined as the filing of a request or lawsuit for the primary purpose of harassing the agency, causing a violation of the law, or for frivolous purpose. Finally, stipulates that the public records law does not allow for monetary damages. Companion to SB 80 and SB 246. *Rep. Danny Burgess (R-Zephyrhills)*

- H. Government Accountability Committee: Reported favorably. Now on the House Calendar.

RESEARCH

P SB 7004 OGSR/Peer Review Panels – Department of Health: Reenacts with minor technical changes an exemption for portions of peer review panels of the James and Esther King Biomedical Research Program and the William G. “Bill” Bankhead, Jr., and David Coley Cancer Research Program during which applications for biomedical research grants are discussed. Also reenacts public record exemptions for (1) records generated during the closed portions of peer review meetings and (2) research grant applications provided to such panels, stipulating that the exempt information can be disclosed upon the written consent of the individual to whom the information pertains or upon court order. Reenacts ss. 215.56021 and 381.92201, F.S. Companion to HB 7041. *S. Health Policy Committee*

- House: Substituted for HB 7041 and passed the House unanimously. **PASSED THE LEGISLATURE.**

HB 7041 OGSR/Peer Review Panels – Department of Health: Reenacts with minor technical changes an exemption for portions of peer review panels of the James and Esther King Biomedical Research Program and the William G. “Bill” Bankhead, Jr., and David Coley Cancer Research Program during which applications for biomedical research grants are discussed. Also reenacts public record exemptions for (1)

records generated during the closed portions of the peer review meetings and (2) research grant applications provided to such panels, stipulating that the exempt information can be disclosed upon the written consent of the individual to whom the information pertains or upon court order. Repeals s. 215.56021 and amends 381.92201, F.S. Companion to SB 7004. *H. Oversight, Transparency and Administration Subcommittee*

- House: Tabled; SB 7004 substituted. See SB 7004.

SECURITY

CS/SB 110 Exemption/Postsecondary Institution Information Technology Security Programs: Creates a public record exemption for records held by a state university or college which identify detection, investigation, or response practices for suspected or confirmed information technology security incidents, including breaches. The exemption applies if disclosure of such records would facilitate unauthorized access to or modification, disclosure, or destruction of data, information, or information technology resources. Also creates an exemption for security information, whether physical or virtual, relating to existing or proposed information technology systems and portions of risk assessments, evaluations, external audits, and other reports of an institution's cyber security programs. Creates an exemption for portions of meetings at which such exempt information is discussed, stipulating that exempt portions of the meetings be recorded. Creates a public record exemption for the recordings of exempt meetings, allowing access by court order. Creates s. 1004.055, F.S. Companion to HB 501. *Sen. Jeff Brandes (R-St. Petersburg)*

- S. Governmental Oversight and Accountability Committee: A minor amendment is adopted. Reported favorably as a committee substitute. Now in S. Rules Committee.

CS/HB 501 Exemption/Postsecondary Institution Information Technology Security Programs: Creates a public record exemption for records held by a state university or college which identify detection, investigation, or response practices for suspected or confirmed information technology security incidents, including breaches. The exemption applies if disclosure of such records would facilitate unauthorized access to or modification, disclosure, or destruction of data, information, or information technology resources. Also creates an exemption for security information, whether physical or virtual, relating to existing or proposed information technology systems and portions of risk assessments, evaluations, external audits, and other reports of an institution's cyber security programs. HB 1079 Exemption/Campus Security Emergency Response: Creates a public record exemption for campus emergency response plans held by a state university or college or by law enforcement or emergency management agencies. Also exempts portions of meetings, which would reveal such exempt information. Defines "campus emergency response plan" as: (1) records, information, photographs, audio and visual presentations, schematic diagrams, surveys, recommendations relating to an act of terrorism; (2) threat assessments; (3) threat response plans; (4) emergency evacuation plans; (5) sheltering arrangements; (6) security manuals; (7) vulnerability analyses; (8) post disaster activities; (9) post disaster

transportation; (10) supplies, including drug caches; (11) staffing; (12) emergency equipment; and (13) information identifying students, faculty, and staff. Allows access by court order and a showing of good cause. Amends s. 1004.0962, F.S. Companion to SB 1224. *Rep. Bob Rommel (R-Naples)*

TRANSPARENCY

SB 1550 Health Information Transparency: Requires the Agency for Health Care Administration to contract with a vendor to investigate and report to the Legislature on opportunities for the development of systems using existing public and private health care data sources for the purpose of providing health care providers with real-time access to patient health care records. Amends s. 408.05, F.S. Companion to HB 1209. *Sen. Frank Artiles (R-Miami)*

- S. Health Policy Committee: A strike all amendment is adopted; reported favorably as a committee substitute. As amended, CS/SB 1550 requires the Agency for Health Care Administration to contract with a vendor to evaluate health information technology activities in the state. Requires the vendor to identify best practices for developing data systems to leverage existing public and private health care data sources for the purpose of providing health care providers with real-time access to patient health care records and requires AHCA to submit a report of the vendor’s findings and recommendations to the legislature. Now in S. Appropriations Committee.

VOTER INFORMATION

SB 862 Exemption/Voters and Voter Registration Information: Creates a public record exemption for all information concerning preregistered voter registration applicants who are 16 or 17 years old. Amends s. 97.0585, F.S. Companion to HB 445. *Sen. Tom Lee (R-Brandon)*
