COURTS

P CS/HB 239 Exemption/Protective Injunction Petitions: Creates a public record exemption for injunctions for protection against domestic violence, repeat violence, dating violence, sexual violence, stalking, or cyber stalking that are dismissed without a hearing or at an ex parte hearing due to failure to state a claim, lack of jurisdiction, or the sufficiency of the petition without an injunction being issued on or after July 1, 2017. Such petitions before July 1, 2017, will be exempt only upon the written request of the person named in the petition as a respondent. Amends s. 119.0714, F.S. Companion to SB 1062. *Rep. Larry Lee (D-Fort Pierce)*

- Senate: Substituted for CS/SB 1062. Passed the Senate unanimously. **PASSED THE LEGISLATURE.**

CS/HB 441 Court Records/Liability: Stipulates that a clerk of court is not liable for the inadvertent release of confidential information contained in a court record if the filer of the record failed to disclose the existence of such information as required by court rule. Amends s. 119.0714(2), F.S. Companion to SB 202. *Rep. Ben Diamond (D-St. Petersburg)* 😊

- House: Passed the House unanimously. Now in Senate Messages.

CS/SB 886 Exemption/Petitions for Involuntary Assessment: Creates a public record exemption for petitions of involuntary assessment and stabilization, court orders, and related records filed with a court. Also provides an exemption for the personal identifying information contained in such records published on a court docket. Allows access by court order. Amends s. 397.6815, F.S. Companion to HB 791. *Sen. Dennis Baxley (R-Lady Lake)*

- Senate: Passed the Senate unanimously. Now in House Messages.

CS/SB 1062 Exemption/Protective Injunction Petitions: Creates a public record exemption a public record exemption for injunctions for protection against domestic violence, repeat violence, dating violence, sexual violence, stalking, or cyber stalking that are dismissed without a hearing or at an ex parte hearing due to failure to state a claim, lack of jurisdiction, or the sufficiency of the petition without an injunction being issued on or after July 1, 2017. Such petitions before July 1, 2017, will be exempt only upon the written request of the person named in the petition as a respondent. Amends s. 119.0714, F.S. Companion to HB 239. *Sen. Bobby Powell (D-West Palm Beach)*

- Senate: Tabled; CS/HB 239 substituted. See CS/HB 239.

SB 1788 Exemption/Identifying Information – Victims of Human Trafficking: Creates a public record exemption for the redacted identifying information and sealed files contained in court files of victims of human trafficking. Amends s. 787.061, F.S. Companion to HB 1417. *Sen. Randolph Bracy (D-Ocoee)*

- S. Criminal Justice Committee: A strike all amendment is adopted; reported favorably as a committee substitute. CS/SB 1788 creates an exemption for court hearings relating to human trafficking and for personal identifying information of human trafficking victims contained in court files or the online docket. Finally, creates a public record exemption for the personal identifying information of victims held by the Statewide Council on Human Trafficking. Now in S. Appropriations Committee.

SB 7028 OGSR/Identifying Information – Victims of Violence: Reenacts, without modification, the public record exemption for the home and employment telephone numbers, cell phone numbers, home or employment addresses, and e-mail addresses of victims of specified violent crimes (domestic violence, repeat violence, sexual violence, and dating violence) provided to the clerks of court and law enforcement in order for the victims to receive automatic notification when a restraining order requested by the victim has been served. Requires the victims to request protection of their personal information in writing and stipulates that the information will be subject to public disclosure five years after the written request is received. Reenacts ss. 741.30(8)(c) and 784.046(8)(c), F.S. Companion to HB 7087. *S. Judiciary Committee*

- S. Governmental Oversight and Accountability Committee: Reported favorably. Now in S. Rules Committee.

CRIMINAL JUSTICE and LAW ENFORCEMENT

P CS/HB 305 Review of Body Camera Footage: Amends the statutory provision requiring adoption of procedures regarding the use of body cameras to allow a law enforcement officer using a body camera to review the recorded footage, upon his or her request, before writing a report or providing a statement. Stipulates that the ability to review recorded footage doesn't apply to an officer's duty to immediately disclose information necessary to secure an active crime scene or to identify witnesses or suspects. Amends s. 943.1718, F.S. Companion to SB 624. *Rep. Shawn Harrison (R-Tampa)*

- Senate: Substituted for CS/SB 624. Passed the Senate unanimously. **PASSED THE LEGISLATURE.**

CS/HB 369 Exemption/Prearrest Diversion Program: HB 367 authorizes adoption of prearrest diversion programs by local communities and educational institutions allowing law enforcement officers, at their discretion, to issue civil citations to those who commit specified qualifying misdemeanor offenses. Those who receive such citations must be provided appropriate health care services and comply with the program's requirements. CS/HB 369 creates a public record exemption for personal identifying information of adults participating in a civil citation or a prearrest diversion program held by a law enforcement agency. Amends s. 901.40, F.S. Companion to SB 450. *Rep. Scott Plakon (R-Longwood)*

- H. Judiciary Committee: A proposed committee substitute is adopted. Reported favorably as a committee substitute by a vote of 16/1, with Rep. Gonzalez voting no. As amended, CS/HB 369 creates a public record exemption for personal identifying information of an adult participating in a civil citation or prearrest diversion program held by a law enforcement agency, a program services provider, or an entity operating a civil citation or prearrest diversion program. Stipulates that the exemption does not apply to the personal identifying information of those adults who fail to complete civil citation or prearrest diversion programs. Allows for the administrative sealing of certain criminal history records. Now on the House Calendar.

CS/SB 624 Review of Body Camera Footage: Amends the statutory provision requiring adoption of procedures regarding the use of body cameras to allow a law enforcement officer using a body camera to review the recorded footage, upon his or her request, before writing a report or providing a statement. Stipulates that the ability to review recorded footage doesn't apply to an officer's duty to immediately disclose information necessary to secure an active crime scene or to identify witnesses or suspects.

Amends s. 943.1718, F.S. Companion to HB 305. *Sen. Greg Steube (R-Sarasota) WATCH*

- Senate: Tabled; CS/HB 305 substituted. See CS/HB 305.

SB 686 Exemption/Sexual Predators – Internet Identifiers: In pertinent part, SB 684 requires sexual predators to register all internet identifiers with FDLE. Defines "internet identifier" as any designation, moniker, screen name, username, or other name used for self-identification to send or receive social internet communications. SB 686 creates a public record exemption for email addresses and internet identifiers reported to FDLE. Amends s. 119.071(5), F.S. Companion to HB 701. *Sen. Dennis Baxley (R-Lady Lake)*

- S. Governmental Oversight and Accountability Committee: Reported favorably. Now in S. Appropriations Committee.

CS/HB 857 Criminal History Records and Mug Shots: Prohibits those who publish mug shots from soliciting or accepting a fee to remove, correct, or modify a mug shot. Requires such publishers to remove a mug shot within 10 days of receiving a written request for removal. Allows the person whose mug shot was published to bring a civil action to enjoin the continued publication of the mug shot if not removed after receiving the written request and allows a court to impose a civil penalty of \$1,000 per day for noncompliance with an order of injunction. Stipulates that refusal to remove a mug shot upon written request constitutes an unfair or deceptive trade practice and that the requirements of the bill apply only to those who solicit or accept payments to remove a mug shot. Also amends s. 943.0586, F.S., to require the Criminal Justice Information program to administratively seal criminal history records relating to an arrest or incident of alleged criminal activity if notified by the clerk of court that charges weren't filed, were dismissed before trial, or the person charged was acquitted or found not guilty.

Amends s. 943.0585, F.S. Companion to SB 118. *Rep. Scott Plakon (R-Longwood)*

- H. Judiciary Committee: A proposed committee substitute making minor changes is adopted; reported favorably as a committee substitute. Now on the House Calendar.

DIRECT SUPPORT ORGANIZATIONS

SB 7002 OGSR/Donors – Publicly Owned Performing Arts Center: Reenacts, with minor technical changes, an exemption for information that would identify a donor or prospective donor to publicly owned performing arts centers if the donor or prospective donor wants to remain anonymous. Reenacts s. 265.7015, F.S. Companion to HB 7113. *S. Community Affairs Committee*

- S. Rules Committee: Reported favorably. Now on the Senate Calendar.

HB 7113 OGSR/Donors – Publicly Owned Performing Arts Center: Reenacts, with minor technical changes, an exemption for information that would identify a donor or prospective donor to publicly owned performing arts centers if the donor or prospective donor wants to remain anonymous. Reenacts s. 265.7015, F.S. Companion to SB 7002. *H. Government Accountability Committee*

- House: Passed unanimously. Now in Senate Messages.

ENVIRONMENT

CS/SB 532 Pollution Reports: Creates the “Public Notice of Pollution Act,” requiring the Department of Environmental Protection to establish and publish a list of substances, which if released or discharged, would present an immediate and substantial risk to the public health, safety or welfare. Requires owners and operators of facilities at which a reportable release occurred to report such release within 24 hours of discovery to DEP. Requires DEP to publish all such notices on a publicly accessible website and to create an email list for all notices, allowing the public and media to subscribe and receive periodic announcements of all notices submitted. Creates s. 403.078, F.S. Companion to HB 1065. *Sen. Bill Galvano (R-Bradenton) WATCH*

- Senate: Passed the Senate unanimously. Now in House Messages.

EXAMINATIONS AND INVESTIGATIONS

CSHB 397 Exemption/Identifying Information – Victims of Alleged Sexual Harassment: Creates a public record exemption for the personal identifying information of the alleged victim in an allegation of sexual harassment. Creates s. 119.071(2)(m), F.S. Companion to SB 492. *Rep. Holly Merrill Raschein (R-Key Largo)*

- House: Passed unanimously. Now in Senate Messages.

CS/HB 437 Exemption/International Financial Institutions: HB 435 revises various statutory provisions relating to financial institutions and creates requirements for international trust companies, including licensure, recordkeeping, permissible activities, liabilities, claims, and allowable fees. CS/HB 437 creates a public record exemption for information identifying customers and potential customers of affiliated international trust entities and names of international trust entity shareholders found in the books and records of an international trust company representative or held by the Office of Insurance Regulation. Also provides an exemption for any information received by the OIR that is otherwise exempt pursuant to the laws of other states or the federal government. Allows for the release of such information under certain, specified conditions. Contains a penalty provision, stipulating that intentional release of the exempt information is a third degree felony. Creates ss. 663.416 and 663.450, F.S.; amends s. 655.057, F.S. Companion to SB 738. *Rep. Daniel Raulerson (R-Plant City)*

- H. Commerce Committee: A proposed committee substitute making minor and technical changes is adopted; reported favorably as a committee substitute. Now on the House Calendar.

CS/HB 981 Exemption/Investigations – Department of Elderly Affairs: Creates a public record exemption for the following information held by the Department of Elderly Affairs about investigations into complaints filed with the Department: (1) the names of the complainant and the ward involved; (2) the ward’s personal health and financial records; and (3) photographs and videos related to the complaint or obtained during the investigation. Allows access by court order and stipulates that such information is subject to disclosure once the investigation is complete or no longer active. Creates s. 744.2111, F.S. Companion to SB 1408. *Rep. Julio Gonzalez (R-Venice)*

- House: Passed the House unanimously. Now in Senate Messages.

HB 1285 Exemption/Chief Inspector General and Agency Inspectors General: Creates public record exemptions for the audit or investigative work papers, records, reports, reviews, inquiries, and other documentation obtained or created in relation to an active audit or investigation conducted by the Chief

Inspector General and agency inspectors general. Stipulates that such records are subject to disclosure once the audit or investigation is complete or a final report is issued. Amends ss. 14.32 and 20.055, F.S. Companion to SB 1480. *Rep. Daniel Raulerson (R-Plant City)*

- H. Government Accountability Committee: Reported favorably. Now on the House Calendar.

SB 1408 Exemption/Investigations – Department of Elderly Affairs: Creates a public record exemption for the following information held by the Department of Elderly Affairs about investigations into complaints filed with the Department: (1) the names of the complainant and the ward involved; (2) the ward’s personal health and financial records; and (3) photographs and videos related to the complaint or obtained during the investigation. Allows access by court order and stipulates that such information is subject to disclosure once the investigation is complete or no longer active. Creates s. 744.2111, F.S. Companion to HB 981. Creates s. 744.20042, F.S. *Sen. Doug Broxson (R-Pensacola)*

- S. Governmental Oversight and Accountability Committee: Reported favorably. Now in S. Rules Committee.

SB 1480 Exemption/Agency Inspectors General: Creates a public record exemption for audit work papers, records, reports, and other documents obtained or created in relation to an active audit or investigation by an agency inspector general. Stipulates that such records are subject to disclosure once the audit or investigation is complete or a final report is issued. Amends s. 20.055, F.S. Companion to HB 1285. *Sen. Dennis Baxley (R-Lady Lake)*

- S. Governmental Oversight and Accountability Committee: A strike all amendment expanding the exemption to include the Chief Inspector General is adopted. Amends ss. 14.32 and 20.055, F.S. Reported favorably as a committee substitute. Now in S. Judiciary Committee.

HOME ADDRESSES

SB 248 Exemption/Home Addresses – OFR Personnel: Creates a public record exemption for the home addresses, telephone numbers, dates of birth, and photographs of current or former non-sworn investigative personnel of the Office of Financial Regulation’s Bureau of Financial Investigation whose duties include the investigation of fraud, theft, other related activities, or state regulatory violations. Also creates an exemption for the names, home addresses, telephone numbers, dates of birth, and places of employment of spouse and children, and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of such personnel. Creates s. 119.071(4)(d)2.V, F.S. Companion to HB 243. *Sen. Doug Broxson (R-Pensacola)*

- S. Governmental Oversight and Accountability Committee: Reported favorably. Now in S. Rules Committee.

HB 7093 OGSR/Home Address Exemptions: There are numerous home address exemptions for a variety of government employees and officers in s. 119.071(4). In 2012, the legislature expanded those exemptions to include within the exemption personal telephone numbers and dates of birth for all of the protected employees and their spouses and children. HB 7093 reenacts the exemptions and expands some to include the names of spouses and children of the employees. The legislation also deletes requirements that those whose home addresses, etc. are exempt from disclosure take reasonable steps to insure that such information isn’t available from other publicly-available sources. Amends s. 119.071(4), F.S. Companion to SB 7018. *H. Oversight, Transparency and Administration Subcommittee*

- House: Passed the House by a vote of 115/4, with Reps. Berman, Cruz, Geller, and Stark voting no. Now in Senate Messages.

INSURANCE

SB 1014 Exemption/Insurer Anti-Fraud Plans: SB 1012 requires certain insurers to adopt anti-fraud plans and provide such information to the Department of Financial Services. CS/SB 1014 creates a public record exemption for information provided by an insurer describing the insurer's (1) required anti-fraud training and anti-fraud investigative unit; and (2) the rationale for the level of anti-fraud staffing and resources provided. Also exempts the (3) number of fraud matters referred to the anti-fraud investigative unit that were not claim related; (4) number of claims investigated or accepted by the anti-fraud investigative unit; (5) number of other insurance fraud matters investigated or accepted by the anti-fraud investigative unit that were not claim related; and (6) estimated dollar amount or range of damages of cases referred to the Division of Investigative and Forensic Services or other agencies. Amends s. 626.9891, F.S. Companion to HB 1009. *Sen. Jeff Brandes (R-St. Petersburg)*

- S. Governmental Oversight and Accountability Committee: Reported favorably. Now in S. Appropriations Committee.

OFFICIAL RECORDS

CS/SB 674 Exemption/Non-Viable Birth Certificates: Creates a public record exemption for information relating to the cause of death, parentage, marital status of the parent, and any medical information included in non-viable birth records. Allows access by court order and for health research purposes. Amends s. 382.008, F.S. Companion to HB 103. *Sen. Aaron Bean (R-Jacksonville)*

- S. Appropriations Committee: Reported favorably. Now on the Senate Calendar.

PERSONAL INFORMATION

CS/SB 1008 Exemption/Division of Workers' Compensation - Injured or Deceased Employees: Creates a public record exemption for personal identifying information of injured or deceased employees contained in reports, notices, records, or supporting documentation held by the Department of Financial Services. Defines "personal identifying information" to include the employee's name, date of birth, home address, email address, and telephone number. Allows access under certain specified circumstances, including a court order and in aggregate reporting formats. Applies the exemption retroactively. Creates s. 440.1851, F.S. Companion to HB 1107. *Sen. Keith Perry (R-Gainesville)*

- S. Governmental Oversight and Accountability Committee: Reported favorably. Now in S. Rules Committee.

CS/HB 1107 Exemption/Division of Workers' Compensation - Injured or Deceased Employees: Creates a public record exemption for personal identifying information of injured or deceased employees contained in notices or reports filed with the Division of Workers' Compensation within the Department of Financial Regulation. Allows access by court order. Amends s. 440.185, F.S. Companion to SB 1008. *Rep. Ben Albritton (R-Bartow)*

- House: An amendment defining "personal identifying information" as the injured or deceased employee's name, date of birth, home or mailing address, email address, and telephone number

and making application of the exemption retroactive is adopted. CS/HB 1107 as amended passed the House unanimously. Now in Senate Messages.

SB 1844 Exemption/Personal Identifying Information – Medical Marijuana Use Registry: Creates a public record exemption for all information contained on a patient’s or caregiver’s compassionate use registry identification card issued in accordance with s. 381.986, F.S. Also exempts all information relating to a doctor’s certification for dispensing marijuana. Allows access under certain specified conditions. Amends s. 381.987, F.S. Companion to HB 7095. *Sen. Rob Bradley (R-Orange Park)*

- S. Governmental Oversight and Accountability Committee: An amendment creating a public record exemption for a patient’s or caregiver’s name, address, date of birth, photograph, telephone number, and all information collected for the purpose of issuing a compassionate use registry identification card. Reported favorably as a committee substitute. Now in S. Appropriations Committee.

SB 7026 OGSR/Unclaimed Property Reports: Reenacts, without modification, the exemption for social security numbers and property identifiers contained in unclaimed property reports held by the Department of Financial Services. Reenacts s. 717.117, F.S. Companion to HB 7045. *S. Banking and Insurance Committee*

- Senate: Tabled; HB 7045 substituted. See HB 7045.

HB 7045 OGSR/Unclaimed Property Reports: Reenacts, without modification, the exemption for social security numbers and property identifiers contained in unclaimed property reports held by the Department of Financial Services. Reenacts s. 717.117, F.S. Companion to SB 7026. *H. Oversight, Transparency and Administration Subcommittee*

- Senate: Substituted for SB 7026 and rolled to third reading for final passage. **HB 7045 is on the Senate’s third reading calendar for final passages on Wednesday, April 26.**

PROPRIETARY INFORMATION

SB 7024 OGSR/Title Insurance Companies – Proprietary Business Information: Reenacts, with minor changes, an exemption for proprietary confidential business information provided to the Office of Insurance Regulation by title insurance agencies and insurers. Defines “proprietary business information” as information that (1) is owned or controlled by the title insurance agency; (2) is intended to be and is treated by the company as private in that disclosure would cause harm to its business operations; and (3) has not been publicly disclosed. Reenacts s. 626.84195, F.S. Companion to HB 7067. *S. Banking and Insurance Committee*

- Senate: Tabled; HB 7067 substituted. See HB 7067.

HB 7067 OGSR/Title Insurance Companies – Proprietary Business Information: Reenacts, with minor changes, an exemption for proprietary confidential business information provided to the Office of Insurance Regulations by title insurance agencies and insurers. Defines “proprietary business information” as information that (1) is owned or controlled by the title insurance agency; (2) is intended to be and is treated by the company as private in that disclosure would cause harm to its business operations; and (3) has not been publicly disclosed. Reenacts s. 626.84195, F.S. Companion to SB 7024. *H. Oversight, Transparency and Administration Committee*

- Senate: Substituted for SB 7024 and rolled to third reading for final passage. **HB 7067 is on the Senate's third reading calendar for final passage on Wednesday, April 26.**

PUBLIC MEETINGS

SB 914 Public Meetings: Amends and clarifies various provisions of Florida's open meetings law, adding definitions of "de facto meeting" and "discussion." Also defines a "meeting" as any gathering, whether formal or informal, of two or more members of the same board or commission. Stipulates that all meetings and de facto meetings at which official acts are to be taken or business is to be transacted or discussed must be open and noticed to the public. Allows fact-finding by members of a board or commission if notice is provided and minutes are taken. Prohibits any action at fact-finding meetings. Also clarifies that members of a board or commission are allowed to socialize with one another. Amends s. 286.011, F.S. Companion to HB 919. *Sen. Dennis Baxley (R-Lady Lake)*

- S. Community Affairs Committee: Reported favorably. Now in S. Rules Committee.

PUBLIC RECORDS

P CS/SB 80 Public Record/Reasonable Attorney Fees and Costs: Amends the attorney fee provision in the public records law, requiring a court to award reasonable costs of enforcement, including attorney fees, to the requestor in lawsuits brought to enforce the public records law if a court (1) determines that the agency violated the law; and (2) the requestor notified the agency's custodian of records of the public record request five days prior to filing the lawsuit. Also requires a court to determine whether the public record request was for an "improper purpose," and, if so, requires the court to award reasonable costs of enforcement against the requestor. "Improper purpose" is defined as the filing of a request or lawsuit for the primary purpose of causing a violation of the law or for frivolous purpose. Stipulates that the public records law does not allow monetary damages. Amends s. 119.12, F.S. Companion to HB 163. *Sen. Greg Steube (R-Sarasota)*

- House: Substituted for CS/HB 163. Passed the House unanimously. **PASSED THE LEGISLATURE.**

CS/HB 163 Public Records/Reasonable Attorney Fees and Costs: Current law requires a court to award reasonable attorney fees and costs when the court finds that an agency violated the public records law. CS/HB 163 amends s. 119.12, F.S., requiring a court to award reasonable costs of enforcement, including attorney fees, to the requestor in lawsuits brought to enforce the public records law if a court (1) determines that the agency violated the law; and (2) the requestor notified the agency's custodian of records in writing of the public record request five days prior to filing the lawsuit. Also requires a court to determine whether the public record request was for an "improper purpose," and, if so, requires the court to award reasonable costs of enforcement against the requestor. "Improper purpose" is defined as the filing of a request or lawsuit for the primary purpose of harassing the agency, causing a violation of the law, or for frivolous purpose. Finally, stipulates that the public records law does not allow for monetary damages. Companion to SB 80 and SB 246. *Rep. Danny Burgess (R-Zephyrhills)*

- House: Tabled. CS/SB 80 is substituted. See CS/SB 80.

SECURITY

CS/HB 501 Exemption/Postsecondary Institution Information Technology Security Programs: Creates a public record exemption for records held by a state university or college which identify detection,

investigation, or response practices for suspected or confirmed information technology security incidents, including breaches. The exemption applies if disclosure of such records would facilitate unauthorized access to or modification, disclosure, or destruction of data, information, or information technology resources. Also creates an exemption for security information, whether physical or virtual, relating to existing or proposed information technology systems and portions of risk assessments, evaluations, external audits, and other reports of an institution's cyber security programs. Creates an exemption for portions of meetings at which such exempt information is discussed, stipulating that exempt portions of the meetings be recorded. Creates a public record exemption for the recordings of exempt meetings, allowing access by court order. Creates s. 1004.055, F.S. Companion to SB 110. *Rep. Tom Leek (R-Daytona Beach)*

- House: Passed unanimously. Now in Senate Messages.

CS/HB 1079 Exemption/Campus Security Emergency Response: Creates a public record exemption for campus emergency response plans held by a state university or college or by law enforcement or emergency management agencies. Also exempts portions of meetings, which would reveal such exempt information. Defines "campus emergency response plan" as: (1) records, information, photographs, audio and visual presentations, schematic diagrams, surveys, recommendations relating to an act of terrorism; (2) threat assessments; (3) threat response plans; (4) emergency evacuation plans; (5) sheltering arrangements; (6) security manuals; (7) vulnerability analyses; (8) post disaster activities; (9) post disaster transportation; (10) supplies, including drug caches; (11) staffing; (12) emergency equipment; and (13) information identifying students, faculty, and staff. Allows access by court order and a showing of good cause. Amends s. 1004.0962, F.S. Companion to SB 1224. *Rep. Bob Rommel (R-Naples)*

- House: CS/HB 1079 passed the House unanimously. Now in Senate Messages.

CS/SB 1224 Exemption/Campus Security Emergency Response: Creates a public record exemption for campus emergency response plans held by a state university or college or by law enforcement or emergency management agencies. Also exempts portions of meetings, which would reveal such exempt information. Defines "campus emergency response plan" as: (1) records, information, photographs, audio and visual presentations, schematic diagrams, surveys, recommendations relating to an act of terrorism; (2) threat assessments; (3) threat response plans; (4) emergency evacuation plans; (5) sheltering arrangements; (6) security manuals; (7) vulnerability analyses; (8) post disaster activities; (9) post disaster transportation; (10) supplies, including drug caches; (11) staffing; (12) emergency equipment; and (13) information identifying students, faculty, and staff. Allows access by court order. Creates s. 1004.0962, F.S. Companion to HB 1079. *Sen. Kathleen Passidomo (R-Naples)*

- S. Governmental Oversight and Accountability Committee: Reported favorably. Now on the Senate Calendar.

VOTER INFORMATION

CS/HB 709 Exemption/Statewide Voter Registration System: HB 707 requires Florida's Secretary of State to enter into agreements with states in order to maintain the statewide voter registration system. CS/HB 709 creates a public record exemption for information received by the Department of State from another state, pursuant to an interstate agreement, that is exempt or confidential pursuant to the laws of that state. Companion to SB 1072. *Rep. Ross Spano (R-Riverview)*

- H. Government Accountability Committee: A strike all amendment making minor changes to the bill is adopted. Reported favorably as a committee substitute. Now on the House Calendar.

CS/SB 1072 Exemption/Statewide Voter Registration System: SB 1010 requires Florida's Secretary of State to enter into agreements with states in order to maintain the statewide voter registration system. HB 709 creates a public record exemption for information received by the Secretary of State that is confidential an exempt in its state of origin. Amends s. 98.075, F.S. Companion to HB 709. *Sen. Travis Hutson (R-Palm Coast)*

- S. Governmental Oversight and Accountability Committee: A strike all amendment is adopted. Reported favorably as a committee substitute. As amended, CS/SB 1072 creates a public record exemption for information received by the Department of State from another state through an interstate agreement for the purpose of sharing and exchanging voter registration information if such information is exempt under the laws of that state. Now in S. Rules Committee.
