Re: HB 379 Pub. Rec./Economic Development Agencies

I write to express the First Amendment Foundation's objection to House Bill 379, which will exempt certain information held by an economic development agency pursuant to its administration of a state or federally funded small business loan program. This exemption will prevent public oversight of government programs.

Recently, more than 100 potentially ineligible recipients received federal Payroll Protection Program (PPP) loans. Nearly \$7.4 million went to businesses ineligible to receive loans under the federal program. In a review of ineligible companies that received loans of at least \$150,000, Florida accounted for more than one out of every four unqualified businesses.

Transparency is necessary to ensure that only eligible businesses receive state and federal loans. Restricting access to government loan programs not only undermines the public's constitutional right of access to public records, but also precludes oversight of government spending. Accordingly, FAF opposes House Bill 379.
